WHAT IS MOVE?

MOVE is for those entering 9th grade in the fall through those who just graduated 12th grade right before this event's dates.

Located on college campuses across the nation, MOVE provides a program for 30,000 students every summer. Students are challenged through intense, interactive worship, dynamic preaching, small group study, and community building. Students at MOVE not only learn and worship together – they spend quality time with their church youth groups, discovering ways that God will use them to impact the world.



MOVE is more than just another conference or camp – it's an experience! It's an all inclusive event providing food, lodging, recreational activities, and an amazing program. Adult leaders are provided small group materials prior to the event, and then meet with

CIY staff each morning to go over each day's lesson. MOVE is committed to helping students take their mountaintop experiences beyond the event by challenging them to become Kingdom workers. To encourage that commitment, each student has the opportunity to open a Kingdom Worker Card on the last day of MOVE. On that card is a challenge to complete something over the next year, no matter how difficult the task.



WHAT WILL STUDENTS ENCOUNTER?

THE MOVE STORE: The MOVE store is the place to purchase MOVE apparel and resources! Send money with your student if they would like to buy something.

ELECTIVES: We give students the opportunity to encounter Kingdom workers, hear Biblical truth taught and be exposed to some great Christian practices during elective time at MOVE. Electives are offered on a range of topics to provide ample opportunity for further discussion.

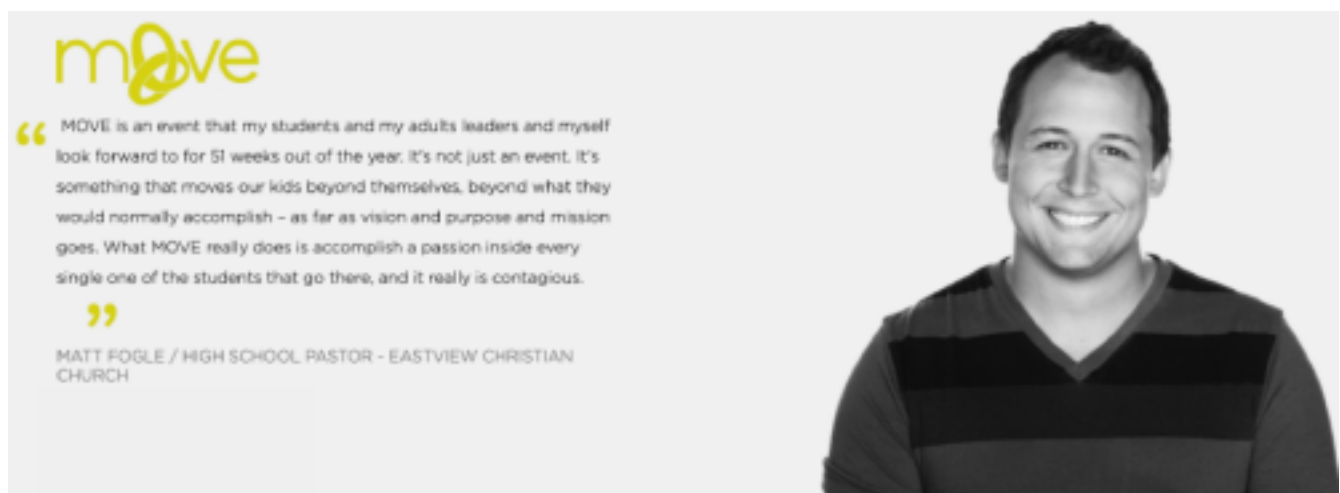
THE MOVE APP: The MOVE app is available on every smart phone platform. The app contains information about MOVE and CIY, devotions for each day, the weekly schedule, and other pages just for fun! This app will guide your group through their week at MOVE.

YOUTH GROUP TIME: Each night after the Evening Session, each group will get together to talk about the day and pray together.

DECISION TIME: At the conclusion of some Evening Sessions, an invitation is offered for students to respond and make a public decision about where they are in their relationship with Christ. Common decisions include accepting Jesus Christ as Savior, repenting of sin, asking for prayer, and determining to pursue ministry as a career.

SKIP-A-MEAL: Once during the week, MOVE asks everyone to skip-a-meal. The money is used to help fund MOVE's International Conferences in places such as India, Ghana, Costa Rica, Philippines, Myanmar, and others. During "skip-a-meal" the campus will not provide a meal, however, our group can go off campus for lunch.

THE ALTERNATIVE: MOVE provides an opportunity for students to share their talents (singing, instrumental, bands, skits, poetry, comedy, etc.) Students sign up for limited spots and perform on the main stage.

AFTERNOON RECREATION: The options at every campus are different and will be announced at the event. MOVE organizes tournaments during some of the afternoons: 3-on-3 basketball, volleyball, Ultimate Frisbee, and dodgeball.

EXTENDED RECREATION: This is an opportunity for our youth group to enjoy an extended afternoon of free time. Each location of MOVE events has a unique array of activities available...hang out at a beach, white water rafting, etc. Your student's youth minister and leaders will choose a special activity for this afternoon.

SMALL GROUP MATERIAL: Your student's youth minister and leaders have the opportunity to review small group material prior to the MOVE event so they can make plans around the material. Small groups are extremely important at MOVE, and the MOVE team works all year developing these lessons and material.

THE NEXT LEVEL: The Next Level is an option for those seniors who just recently graduated. It's an in-depth Bible study taught by the Morning Speaker while everyone else is in SELAH. It's a great opportunity for them to get an inside glimpse of each day's theme, ask questions, and be challenged in their faith.

SELAH: Following Good Morning MOVE, students and leaders are dismissed to SELAH and Small Groups. This creates an opportunity for them to participate in devotions that are tied to the daily themes.

GOOD MORNING MOVE: Good Morning MOVE is designed to wake students up through funny videos, engaging interaction, and whatever crazy ideas MOVE can come up with.

KINGDOM WORKERS: A Kingdom worker is a Christian who uses whatever sphere of influence he or she has to proclaim the message of Jesus. Kingdom workers include school teachers, moms, high school basketball players, bass guitarists, doctors and a countless list of others. Their ministry may look different, but they have each surrendered to Jesus and are committed to using their gifts, abilities, and relationships to advance His Kingdom.

DAILY SCHEDULE SAMPLE

What can you do while your student is at MOVE?

We can't stress enough how powerful praying for your student while they are encountering the Gospel and teachings of Scripture during a MOVE event! Below are a couple of examples of how you can pray for your students before, during, and after MOVE:

CIY's mission is to amplify the call on students lives to be Kingdom Workers. Your student will be challenged at MOVE to make their faith active. Pray that God would speak clearly into their hearts on how they can become kingdom workers in their homes, schools, and relationships.

Some students are going to be hearing the Gospel for the very first time at MOVE. Pray that it will take root in their lives and that they would accept the message of Jesus.

The desire of MOVE staff is to come alongside student ministers and leaders to give them an opportunity to build lasting, meaningful relationships with their students. Pray that God would open communication between students and their leaders to not only get tough questions answered, but build the foundations for solid relationships too.

Experiences like this can - without a doubt - bring up tough life situations, hard questions, past or present sins, and / or future insecurities. Pray that students will be comfortable opening up to their peers and being brave in asking for help if needed.

Students attending MOVE will get to visit a Christian college campus. Whether students plan on attending college or not, pray that students see, hear, and comprehend what a culture of continued faith development beyond their high school years looks like.

WHAT TO BRING & WHAT NOT TO BRING

What to bring:

- Bible
- notebook & pen/pencil
- clothing for five days, for normal wear and for recreation time (Plan on bringing 2 sets of clothing for each of days 2, 3, & 4. One of these two sets should be suitable for getting dirty and/or wet. It is also a good idea to bring jeans and a lightweight jacket for the possibility of cool evenings.)
- bathing suits (one piece preferred; two-piece may be worn with a dark shirt over top)
- personal toiletry items including prescription medications
- towel
- pillow and bedding/sleeping bag to fit a single bed
- camera/phone
- money for meals while traveling, snacks, merchandise/souvenirs, offering, etc.
- optional: athletic equipment for recreation time

What NOT to bring:

- alcohol, cigarettes, vapes, drugs, weapons of any kind etc.
- a bad attitude

Leave Date: June 15, 2026 – **Students will arrive at the church at 10:30 AM on Sunday, June 9** to load their belongings (See packing list).

3) Complete an FCCM medical/permission form if you have not already completed one for this student in 2026. The paper version is available from the Rise kiosk or the office. The online version can be found at fccmonline.org/move.

4) Pay at least \$100 of the cost by April 26. Another \$50 is due by May 28.
